◀ THE LEGACY ▶



In 1998, the daughters of the late Martha Mason Hill (1911 – 1985) established the Martha Mason Hill Memorial Foundation in her memory. Her story is that of many extraordinary women of her era who, in spite of their circumstances, managed to help their children rise to a better place in life. Many others were beneficiaries of her selflessness as well. She was often heard singing one of her favorite songs, “This Little Light of Mine”, the words of which accurately described her life.

She practiced her faith and was a very nurturing person whose kindness and consideration towards others knew no bounds. We will never know the full extent of her philanthropic work, for she was not prone to publicize or boast about her good deeds. We do know, however, that her loving and caring ways had a lasting impact on many people. She was admired and respected by those who knew her.

Among her many fine qualities was her strong belief in the value of education. She was honored at Virginia State University (then College) for ensuring that all 7 of her daughters attended the College, where she worked as a housekeeper for 40 years. Two grandchildren she reared are also alumni. Her family hopes to continue her legacy through the Foundation.

Martha Mason Hill Memorial Foundation (MMHMF) ENDOWMENT FUND was created to continue the work of the Foundation indefinitely. An additional Endowed Scholarship Fund was established at Virginia State University in the fall of 2011.

HONORING FOUNDATION MEMBER AND CO-FOUNDER

SARAH HILL CHEATHAM (88 years young), 3rd of the 7 daughters of Martha Mason Hill

Member of the Board of Directors, Former Secretary and Current Assistant Secretary
of the Executive Committee, Member of Hospitality and Outreach Committees.

Sarah has been an active member since the Martha Mason Hill Foundation was established in 1998, and she is still going strong! Her efforts in support of the Foundation are largely part of the reason it has become successful and so well known throughout the community. She is our goodwill ambassador and has all types of greeting cards: Get Well, Graduation, Happy Birthday, Thinking of You, Sympathy, Mother's and Father's Day...second to none! Members will attest that she never misses a member's birthday, sending cards with a small gift enclosed. She also sends graduating high school seniors a daily devotional book each year of behalf of the Foundation.

Sarah is "her mother's child." Being raised under the tutelage of Martha Mason Hill, she grew up in the church, and learned early the importance of education and service to others. Educated in Chesterfield County Schools, she attended Union Grove where her classroom was also used for a sewing class that made uniforms for soldiers. She graduated 3rd in her class from Carver High School, the only high school at the time for African Americans in the County. With the support and encouragement of her mother, she subsequently earned her Bachelors' degree in Library Science and Masters' degree in Educational Media from Virginia State College, now Virginia State University. She was employed by Chesterfield County in 1962 as the first African American elementary librarian. Serving eight schools, she remembers how challenging it was to order books and transport them in the back of her car to have a book fair in each school. She also can recall being among some of the first faculty members sent to all white schools when integration began in 1964 for all students, though it was left up to them to decide to do so or not. When asked what or who were major influences in her life, she has said over the years there were several people who helped her, but the most influential role model was her mother. Similar to her mother, Sarah enjoys helping someone whenever the opportunity presents itself. She especially loves assisting and encouraging children.

We marvel at Sarah's dedication and the continued level of effort she exerts on behalf of the Foundation! We are so grateful to have her on our team. Thank you, Sarah!

SARAH'S BIOGRAPHY

Sarah H. Cheatham, daughter and of the late Thomas E. and Martha M. Hill, was reared in Chesterfield County, Virginia. She attended Union Grove Elementary School that had three classrooms at the time. Her principal, who was her teacher in the 6th grade, was Mrs. M.L. Wartman. A part of her classroom was used by Mrs. Owens who taught sewing to students. The students made items that were needed by the soldiers serving in the Armed Forces.

Upon completion of elementary school, she attended Daniel Webster Davis High School that required five years instead of the usual four for graduation. After two years at Daniel Webster Davis, she transferred to Carver High School where she graduated in 1951. Carver High School was newly built in the county for African American students. Carver was composed of students from Hickory Hill High School (in North Chesterfield) and Daniel Webster High School (in South Chesterfield). After high school, she pursued further education at Virginia State College, now Virginia State University, where she received a B.S. Degree in Library Science and a M.S. Degree in Educational Media

Her first job was in Charles City County, Virginia in 1959. She remembers having to ride the Ferry for the first time to Charles City. She lived with the Jones Family during the week and returned home on weekends.

In 1962, she was employed by Chesterfield County, becoming the first African American elementary school librarian in the County. She served all eight elementary schools, namely Bermuda, Dupuy, Hickory Hill, Kingsland, Midlothian, Union Branch, Union Grove and Winterpock. She wanted to expose students to a variety of books, more than just those in their school library. She remembers transporting all those books in the back of her car. One student recalls her telling them "books can take you to places all over the world." After 2 years, another librarian, Mrs. Lucy Robinson was hired. Sarah then served 5 smaller schools, then 3, then 2 and finally one, Ettrick Elementary.

Chesterfield County Schools integrated in 1964. African American students were given a choice to remain in their own school or go to the predominantly white schools. Dr. Alcorn was the Superintendent, and he chose one group with full time teachers and itinerant teachers, both black and white, to teach in predominantly white schools during the 1964-65 school year. At the end of 1965, he chose another group of full-time teachers and itinerant teachers for the 1965-66 school year. Both groups met together at the end of the first year to discuss problems and solutions. Sarah remembers being in the second group and being sent to two predominately white schools: Ettrick and Enon Elementary.

Sarah has been active in Union Grove Baptist Church for more than 60 years. As a member she has served in the Deaconess Ministry, Finance Ministry, Pulpit Hospitality Committee, Missionary Ministry, Sunday School Teacher of Primary Class, sponsor of Baptist Youth Fellowship, sponsor and treasurer of the Golden Circle, member of the Junior and Senior choirs, and chairperson of the Personnel Committee.

Sarah has also been active in the community. She has served as treasurer of the Alease Cooley Memorial Tent (a subsidiary of United Order of Tents) for more than 50 years, financial secretary of Union Grove/Faith, Hope and Charity Lodge, and treasurer of the Imperial order of King David Lodge, member of Carver Reunion Group and a charter member of Virginia State Alumni Association (Chesterfield Chapter).

She married Clifton Cheatham, Sr. in 1952, and they had three children: Clifton, Gilda, and Gina. She has 13 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

MY REFLECTIONS OF SARAH HILL CHEATHAM

What got me to thinking about Sis Sarah was seeing a CBS WTVR 6 news report on two Chesterfield County elementary school teachers being recognized for starting a book mobile in the community. The Matoaca Supervisor Kevin Carroll was on hand at the recognition and people were cheering and acting as if this was something totally new. Well, I started first grade in 1960 at Union Grove Elementary School which was one of the Julius Rosenwald/Booker T. Washington schools for black children. While there, Sarah was the school librarian, and though the library was one small room, for me as a small child, it was huge with all these books. Sarah told us how to use the card catalog and where to find books based on that Dewey Decimal Classification. We had certain days that we could go to the library to check out books. Sarah would come to the classrooms to read to the children and always encouraged us to read. She told us you can learn about places all over the world and travel through reading. I recall Sarah carrying books around in the back seat and trunk of her car. I recently found out that she transported the books from school to school for a book fair.


Some days, Sarah would leave school early, and I thought she was just going home. Little did we know she was going to other black schools to do for them what she was doing for us at Union Grove. I think I had finished college before I discovered that Sarah's day wasn't over when she left Union Grove and I did not know until recently that she had to travel to all EIGHT of the black schools in all of Chesterfield County, no easy task!

The library was also the same room where we had dental checkups. Not sure how often the dentist came but I recall a dentist who seemed to have been military connected and the dentist chair was plopped in the middle of the library. I'm not sure how Sarah worked around that one and at my age didn't understand why the dentist would be at our school. I didn't have a clue that we were supposed to be "underprivileged" children. Never once did I ever hear Sarah using that terminology to us, and the entire time she was struggling to get books for the school. Before I left Union Grove, I remember Sarah having the County book mobile come to our school and she told us we would be able to check out and return books to the book mobile too. So, what was new to some people in 2021 was old news for use since this was probably a first for our area thanks to librarian, Sarah Hill Cheatham in the 1960s!



CARE PACKAGES SENT TO COLLEGE STUDENTS

BOOKS FOR CARVER MIDDLE SCHOOL'S 30,000 BOOKS FOR CLASSROOM LIBRARIES PROJECT

Gayle Sutton is the POC for Carver Middle School and Matoaca Middle School.



In the spring of 2020, Gayle applied for a grant from Dollar General to purchase books to support Carver Middle School's literacy initiative. We received a grant of \$2,000.00 to help Carver build a library in each classroom. The school's goal is to acquire 30,000 books. Gayle worked with the school and Barnes and Noble to purchase the books. Gayle and Barbara picked up 127 books from Barnes and Noble for Carver Middle in October 2020. This is a partial order. Two additional orders were placed in early 2021. A total of \$2,500 was spent.


